Costa Rica Trip Olive Ridley Arribada



An Adventure of a Lifetime

Explore the cloud forest of the majestic Monteverde Mountains, the wetlands of the Tempisque River delta, and the lifetime experience of witnessing an Olive Ridley Sea Turtle arribada. Walk through canopy bridges, take a boat safari, whale watching outing, and sea turtles nesting.



Itinerary

Day 1: Arrival to San Jose

Transfer to Bougainvillea Hotel in the town of Heredia

Day 2: Monteverde Mountains

Fonda Vela Hotel. Canopy exploration at Monteverde Cloud Forest Hanging Bridges

Day 3: Monteverde Mountains

Hike at the Cloud Forest preserve.

Afternoon coffee tour at a local farm

Day 4: Rancho Humo

Departure to Rancho Humo-Afternoon boat tour on the Tempisque River and Palo Verde National Park

Day 5: Rancho Humo

Morning exploration of the Rancho Humo wetlands. Afternoon visit to local town and women cooperative.

Day 6: Nosara Beach

Departure to Lagarta Lodge-Night visit to Ostional-Arribada Beach

Day 7: Ostional-Lagarta Lodge

Morning visit to Ostional Beach. Afternoon hike through Lagarta private preserve, a combination of mangrove forest and tropical dry forest

Day 8: Day boat tour

Catamaran tour of the Pacific coast, looking for Humpback Whales

Day 8: Departure from Liberia airport

Important Note: Arrival flight should be to San Jose airport, departure flight should be from Liberia airport

Day 1: Tuesday, Nov 12

Arrival in San Jose (SJO)



Upon arrival at San Jose International Airport (SJO), our driver will be waiting to transfer you to the Bougainvillea Hotel. Set among 10 acres of award-winning gardens, the Bougainvillea Hotel is a lush haven within the town of Heredia, known by Costa Ricans as the "La Ciudad de las Flores" (City of Flowers).

The group will gather in the evening for our welcome dinner at the hotel's elegant Vitrales restaurant.

Breakfast at the hotel. Departure to the Monteverde Mountains in central Costa Rica with a stop-in route for a hike at the Monteverde Skywalk Hanging Bridges.

The trails and bridges of this private reserve will bring you up close to the birds, flowers, and lush vegetation of the Cloud Forest.

Afternoon arrival at the Hotel Heliconia, a family-owned lodge with its own protected Cloud Forest Preserve.


Day 3: Thurs, Nov 14

Morning visit to a local coffee farm for a coffee tour. Learn how to grow, harvest and process the best coffee in the world.

Afternoon visit to the Monteverde Cloudforest Preserve, a great example of the local benefits of eco-tourism, followed by a late afternoon visit to the Hummingbird Gallery. A series of hummingbird feeders that attract up to 12 species of hummingbirds. From the giant Violet Sabrewing to the tiny Coppery Headed Emerald. Get your cameras and binoculars ready!



After breakfast, we depart to Estancia Rancho Humo on the Tempisque River wetlands, our home for the next two nights.

Rancho Humo was transformed from a cattle farm into an international example of wetland rescue where visitors can experience numerous ecosystems: mangroves, wetlands, tropical dry forests, and pastures. It is home to a large variety of flora and fauna including wading birds, hawks, ducks, and the largest and most exotic aquatic bird in Costa Rica: the famous Jabirú stork.

Rancho Humo is located near a traditional and picturesque town, Puerto Humo.

After breakfast, we will depart to explore the Rancho Humo wetlands on board safari Jeeps. We are likely to see diverse aquatic birds, crocodiles, and other local wildlife.

During the afternoon, we will visit a local women's cooperative in the nearby town of Pozo Azul. The women will teach us the traditional ways to prepare the local cheese called "cuajada" and the typical corn base pastries from the area.


Morning departure to Lagarta Lodge. Near Ostional Wildlife Refuge. Olive Ridley Sea Turtles nest in mass at Ostional year-round. Arribadas occur regularly once, sometimes even twice, a month and the numbers of nesting females could range from hundreds to thousands.

Arribadas are only observed in 6 locations worldwide, two of those in Costa Rica. They also occur in Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, and India.

The largest Arribada thus far recorded in Ostional took place in November of 1995 when an estimated 500,000 females came ashore.

Morning departure to see the Ostional Beach sea turtle arribada.

Afternoon hike at Lagarta Lodge private biological preserve. This hike will explore the Mangrove Habitat and the Tropical Dry Forest. Great chances to see Howler Monkeys and diverse wildlife.

Morning departure to explore the coastal waters by Catamaran Boat. Our goal is to see Humpback Whales that come to the warm waters of Costa Rica every year for calving.

We could also see dolphins and potentially mating Olive Ridley Sea Turtles en route to the nesting beach.

Afternoon visit Samara Beach.
