# May 12-20, 2025 Costa Rica Leatherback Turtle Trip



# An Adventure of a Lifetime

Join this customized, small-group nature trip through Costa Rican ecosystems. Witness the nesting of giant Leatherback Sea Turtles on the Caribbean coast of Costa Rica, one of the world's main nesting colonies of this majestic endangered species. Walk through rainforests, explore active volcanoes, and search for sloths, toucans, monkeys and other tropical wildlife.



### Itinerary

### Day 1: Arrival to San Jose

First night at Bougainvillea Hotel. Welcome dinner at hotel restaurant.

### **Day 2: Arenal Volcano**

Departure to Arenal Observatory Lodge. Visit a local Costa Rican home.

### Days 3: Arenal Volcano

Exploration of the Arenal Observatory gardens and private rain forest preserve.

### Day 4: GandocaMazanillo

Departure to Cariblue Hotel-Night outing in search of Leatherback sea turtles.

### Day 5: Cahuita National Park

Morning hike in Cahuita National Park. Afternoon at leisure at the beach

### Day 6: Punta Mona

Morning hike at Punta Mona preserve. Afternoon exploring local town.

### Days 7-Orosi Valley

Morning charter flight to San Jose. Departure to Quelitales Lodge.

### **Day 8: Quelitales Lodge**

Morning visit to Irazu Volcano. Afternoon hike at Rio Macho National Park

### Day 9: Transfer to San Jose Airport

## Day 1: Monday, May 12

## Arrival in San Jose



Our morning drive will take us across the Continental Divide and through the vast rainforest of Braulio Carrillo National Park. Shortly after crossing the National Park, we will stop at Pierella Gardens for lunch and explorations of the gardens.

Pierella Gardens is a butterfly farm, where over 60 species of butterflies are raised for exportation. We will tour the gardens guided by a local naturalist. Pierella is also a great place to see tropical birds, sloths, monkeys, and other wildlife.

Afternoon arrival at Arenal Observatory.

Upon arrival at San Jose International Airport (SJO), we will be transferred to the Bougainvillea Hotel.

Within 30 minutes from the airport and set among 10 acres of lush tropical gardens, this comfortable hotel in the capital is a great place to start our tropical adventure in Costa Rica.

## Day 2: Tuesday, May 13





Early morning birding on the lodge's trails, followed by breakfast. After breakfast, we depart for a walk through the waterfall trail. Within our hotel's protected area, this is a great location to see abundant wildlife and a spectacular waterfall.

Afternoon exploring the gardens and forest at the hotel.

We will end the day with a night hike to the famous frog pond, where we are likely to see the amazing red-eye tree frog and several other species.

# Day 4: Thursday, May 15 Cariblue Hotel



Morning departure to the south Caribbean coast.

Today we break our drive with a stop at the home of Costa Rican naturalist Jairo Lacayo. An old friend of Carlos and Ricardo, he has turned his backyard into a paradise for wildlife. We will eat lunch on Jairo's porch while watching the activity at his many bird feeders. After lunch, we continue to the Caribbean coast, which is populated by descendants of Jamaicans. This region has a distinct culture, cuisine, and language.

The vegetation in this area is lush and biodiversity is among the highest in Costa Rica. Depending on circumstance, we may seek sea turtles this night.

## Day 5: Friday, May 16

## Cahuita National Park



After breakfast, we will drive a short distance to the Punta Mona preserve, for a hike through the rainforest and coastal environment. Great chances to see twotoed sloths, three-toed sloths and the iconic golden eyelash viper.

Afternoon at leisure to enjoy the beach or explore the local town of Puerto Viejo.



Early morning birding walk through the lodge's trails, followed by breakfast. After breakfast, we will depart for nearby Cahuita National Park. This park protects 1,106 hectares of pristine coastal rainforest and 22,300 hectares of the marine environment including the most vibrant coral reefs in Costa Rica.

Our hike through the park will present great bird-watching opportunities and chances to see other wildlife such as sloths, monkeys, and the colorful Golden Eyelash Viper. We will spend the afternoon at leisure with the opportunity to explore the beach and enjoy the hotel amenities.

Night visit to Gandoca Manzanillo beach to search for nesting leatherbacks.

## Quelitales Lodge



Early morning visit to the Irazu Volcano, the highest and largest in Costa Rica. The crater has a 0.5-mile diameter, and you will find yourself in a flat and impressive lunar landscape. Afternoon visit to Rio Macho National Park. This massive rainforest preserve encompasses multiple types of forests which provide a home to a myriad of tropical wildlife including tapirs, white-faced capuchin monkeys, kinkajous, ocelots, jaguarundi, rare endemic orchids, and the largest moth on the American continent. Additionally, National Park hosts over 400 bird species including resplendent quetzels, emerald toucanets, and violaceous trogons.



After breakfast, our bus will take us on a 3hour drive through the countryside. We'll enjoy lunch en route at a local restaurant.

We reach Quelitales Hotel, a birding hot spot located on the border of Rio Macho National Park with a view of the Irazu Volcano. Here it is possible to see over 70% of Costa Rica's hummingbird species.

Afternoon hikes through our hotel's rainforest trails and gardens. Or visit Doña Ana waterfall.
