Costa Rica Biodiversity Trip



Join this unforgettable adventure through Costa Rica's most biodiverse destinations.

After a relaxing night in San José, we head to Costa Rica's South Caribbean coast, where we spend two nights at Cariblue Beach and Jungle Resort. From this tropical base, we explore Cahuita National Park, known for its abundant wildlife.

Next, we board a private charter flight across the country to the South Pacific coast, where we stay at the Punta Marenco Lodge. From there, we explore Corcovado National Park—one of the most biologically intense places on Earth. This remote and pristine wilderness is home to an incredible variety of wildlife, including monkeys, scarlet macaws, and even the elusive jaguar. Our adventure concludes with two days in the Talamanca Mountains at the cozy Savegre Lodge, exploring the misty heights of the Cloud Forest. Here in one of the country's most peaceful

Cariblue Beach & Jungle



Early departure to the town of Cocles on Costa Rica's southern Caribbean coast, for two nights at Carblue Beach and Jungle Resort. On the way, we will stop for a hike in Braulio Carrillo National Park, one of the largest and most diverse national parks in the country, covering 50,000 hectares of protected rainforest.

The Caribbean coast of Costa Rica is distinct from the rest of the country. Its people are of African and Caribbean descent, with a rich and unique culture, cuisine, and language.

The lush vegetation of this region supports some of the highest biodiversity in Costa Rica. Sloths are commonly spotted in the treetops, making wildlife encounters an everyday experience.

Cahuita National Park




Early morning birding walk through the lodge's grounds, followed by breakfast. After, we will depart for Cahuita National Park.

This park protects 1,106 hectares of pristine coastal rainforest and 22,300 hectares of the marine environment, including the most vibrant coral reefs in Costa Rica.

Our hike through the park will present great bird-watching opportunities and chances to see other wildlife such as sloths, monkeys, and the colorful Golden Eyelash Viper.

Afternoon at leisure to explore the beach and enjoy the hotel amenities.

Corcovado National Park



A morning boat transfer will take us to Corcovado National Park, a place National Geographic has called "the most biologically intense place on Earth."

Covering 164 square miles, Corcovado is Costa Rica's largest national park, renowned for its incredible biodiversity and thriving populations of rare and endangered species, including Baird's tapir, jaguars, and harpy eagles.

We will spend most of the day exploring Corcovado, hiking through ancient lava flows, pristine rainforests, and untouched beaches, immersing ourselves in one of the wildest and awe-inspiring landscapes in the world.

We begin the day with a scenic boat ride along the coast, making our way to the mouth of the Sierpe River.

From there, we'll navigate upstream through the winding waterways until we arrive at the town of Sierpe, where our private bus will be waiting to take us to the Talamanca Mountains the tallest mountain range in Costa Rica.

Our destination, Savegre Lodge, is nestled in a hidden valley deep in the mountains, offering a peaceful retreat surrounded by lush cloud forests. This area is one of the best places to spot the Resplendent Quetzal, a stunningly beautiful bird revered by the ancient Maya civilization.

Talamanca Mountains



After breakfast, we will board the hotel's Land Rovers and ascend to an ancient oak forest at the top of the mountain range.

From there, we will embark on a leisurely hike back down to the lodge, immersing ourselves in the beauty of the high-altitude cloud forest.

Along the way, we will encounter unique bird species, towering ferns, and a diverse array of flora and fauna characteristic of this region.

After breakfast, we will take a short drive to a local bird feeder station, where we can enjoy a cup of Costa Rican coffee while we sit and wait for the birds to come.

At mid-morning, we could hike to a local waterfall. On the way, we will stop to take a look at the local Savegre Botanical Garden and succulent nursery.

The afternoon will be at leisure, with the option to take a stroll into town or simply relax at the lodge, enjoying its peaceful atmosphere and amenities such as the marvelous Savegre Spa.
