Day 9: Sky Walk & Chocolate



Day 1: Sun, January 31

Arrival in Liberia (LIR)



When you arrive at the quaint Liberia airport in the northern Pacific zone of Costa Rica our driver Ricardo will be waiting for you. We'll stop for lunch at a local restaurant, then continue to our first accommodation. With breathtaking views overlooking two rivers, sandy beaches, and lush forests along Pacific coast, Lagarta Lodge has gained worldwide recognition as one of the finest luxury hotels in Costa Rica. Bordering a protected nature reserve, this boutique eco-lodge blends nature-inspired elegance with a deep commitment to sustainability and community.

Morning departure to Ostional Beach, one of the most important nesting sites in the world for rare olive ridley sea turtles. Up to 500,000 adult females have nested here during an arribada event and we hope to witness the massive emergence of baby hatchlings crawling to the sea from these nests in broad daylight.

Afternoon hike through Lagarta Lodge's private biological preserve exploring the unparalleled beauty and diversity of mangrove habitat and tropical dry forest. We'll have great chances to see numerous bird species, howler monkeys, anteaters, coatis, iguanas, and butterflies.

Whale Watching



Morning boat outing to explore the coastal waters of the Nicoya Peninsula where gigantic humpback whales congregate every winter to both mate and give birth. At this time of year we can observe calves swimming and playing alongside their mothers, as well as males singing and displaying to impress mates. We are also likely to see various dolphins species, sea turtles mating, and other marine wildlife.

Free afternoon to enjoy our lodge's amenities or take a stroll on the nearby idyllic white sand beaches.

Dinner and overnight at the luxurious Lagarta Lodge.

After breakfast we'll head to our next mountain destination, the Borinquen Thermal Resort. This retreat in the highlands includes a lovely large pool as well as thermal springs with hot pools, and a natural steam-room above a stream.


The climate combines the Guanacaste dry and sunny weather with the fresh air of the mountains. All bungalows have private decks or balconies with great mountain views and breathtaking sunsets.

Afternoon hike at Borinquen Lodge exploring the gardens and grounds which include steam vents, and fumaroles and a nearby nature trail leads us along a boiling stream to ancient petroglyphs.

Rincon de la Vieja



Early morning bird watching at the lodge grounds, followed by a visit to the fantastic Rincon de la Vieja National Park – part of a UNESCO World Heritage Site. As we hike through exotic dry tropical forest, steaming fumaroles, mini-geysers, and bubbling volcanic mud pits create an incredible experience that will make you wonder if you have visited another planet.

Named “the Colossus of Guanacaste”, Rincon de la Vieja is the largest active volcano in Costa Rica. Standing at 6,286 feet high and nine miles wide, the massive 600,000-year-old geological wonder has at least nine volcanic craters and 32 rivers flow down its sides as it bridges the Continental Divide.

Rincon de la Vieja National Park is home to 300 bird species and many mammals, including white-faced, howler, and spider monkeys, armadillos, collared peccaries, pumas, and white-nosed coatis.

After breakfast, the lodge’s all-terrain pickup truck will drive us to a spectacular lookout point near the top of the mountain range offering panoramic views. Our walk back down will take us, through primary and secondary forest, to hidden waterfalls, and through open grasslands, offering diverse birding opportunities.

After our adventures, you will have the afternoon to explore and enjoy the lodge’s gardens and amenities. You can take advantage of the curative properties that have long been attributed to these mineral rich waters and volcanic mud through the unique experience of relaxing in a hot spring-fed pool, or receiving a relaxing massage, mud bath, or facial in the luxurious Anáhuac Spa.

After breakfast, we'll begin our journey across the Talamanca mountain range to our next destination. Originally built as a research station for the Smithsonian Institution, Arenal Observatory Lodge & Trails offers unmatched access to over 800 acres of rainforest, with manicured trails leading to waterfalls and extravagant gardens designed to attract wildlife, such as jewel-toned hummingbirds, brilliant butterflies, and an array birds.

The only hotel located with Arenal Volcano National Park—the lodge provides the closest possible views of the towering volcano.

After breakfast we'll head to Rainforest Chocolate Tour. This hands-on experience will take us from cacao harvest to finished chocolate, exploring its history, cultural significance, and traditional preparation. We'll learn how the "Gift of the Gods" was used in ancient Mesoamerica as both a ceremonial drink and currency and then enjoy tasting high-quality organic chocolate.

After dinner at the lodges scenic restaurant overlooking the volcano and lake. We'll take a night hike to a frog pond in search of red-eye tree frogs and other creatures.

Hanging Bridges



The Arenal Hanging Bridges feature 15 suspension bridges spanning a mature tropical transition wet forest. Walking above the canopy offers a unique perspective and rare views of wildlife including epiphytic plants, snakes, butterflies, and monkeys .

Located at the meeting point of highland and lowland ecosystems, the park hosts remarkable biodiversity—over 700 plant species and 300 bird species, from highland bellbirds to lowland toucans and crested guans.

As part of a vital biological corridor connecting the Guanacaste and Tilarán volcanic ranges, it also supports large mammals such as pumas, jaguars, and tapirs.

After ten days of exploring Costa Rica, our adventure must come to an end. Take home epic photos and memories of a lifetime to share with loved ones.

Important Note: You must book your flight using the multi-city option.

Book your arrival flight to Liberia (Airport code LIR) on Jan 31, close to 12 pm. Delta Airlines and American Airlines have flights that arrive at LIR about noon. Liberia Daniel Oduber Airport is in the northern Pacific zone of Costa Rica.

Book your departure flight from the San Jose airport (airport code SJO) after 12 pm on Feb 9. We will get you to the airport with plenty of time to catch any flight departing in the afternoon.
